

Best student oral paper selection guidelines.

1. Research relevance, novelty and impact. (20 points)

Relevance to industry, academia and society (10 points); background and significance, has the issue been adequately described (10 points).

2. Research technical quality. (30 points)

Has the question and the objectives been clearly described (15 points); have the experimental design and analysis been clearly described (15 points)?

3. Discussion of results and conclusions. (30 points)

Are the results presented clearly and concisely and in manner that is easy to follow (15 points); are the conclusions valid and clearly presented (15 points)?

4. Presentation technique. (20 points)

Were all the slides easy to read and understand, not too many lines of data or complex figures, and the key points of each slide drawn to the attention of the audience (10 points); did the presenter address the audience, were they clearly audible (10 points).
